Today: Feast of the Most Holy Trinity

From the beginning of the liturgical year in Advent until today, the Church has had us consider the magnificent manifestations of God's love toward His people: the Incarnation, the Redemption, and Pentecost. Now she directs our attention to the source of these gifts, the most Holy Trinity, from whom everything precedes. The mercy of **God the Father**, "who so loved the world that He gave it His only-begotten Son" (cf. John 3, 16); the mercy of **God the Son**, who to redeem us became incarnate and died on the Cross; the mercy of **God the Holy Spirit**, who sent into our hearts to communicate to us the charity of God and to allow us participation in the divine life. The Father is charity, the Son is grace and the Holy Spirit is communication. Our God is a community of Persons who share life among themselves and pour out that life to us. But the mystery of the Trinity is love, a divine life into which we are invited. In response we can make St. Paul's words in 2 Corinthians 12, 2-4 our own: "O the depth of the riches of the wisdom and of the knowledge of God! How incomprehensible are His judgments, and how unsearchable are His ways!"
