

## **Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ**

The Solemnity of *Corpus Christi*, which commemorates the institution of the Holy Eucharist, was introduced in the late 13th century to encourage the faithful to give special honor to the Blessed Sacrament. The official title of this Solemnity was changed in 1970 to The Body and Blood of Christ.

Today we can reflect on what the Catholic Catechism officially teaches about the Holy Eucharist in the following sections

**#1324** The Eucharist is the "source and summit of the Christian life." "The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the Blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ Himself, our Pasch."

**#1325** "The Eucharist is the efficacious sign and sublime cause of that communion in the divine life and that unity of the People of God by which the Church is kept in being. It is the culmination both of God's action sanctifying the world in Christ and of the worship men offer to Christ and through Him to the Father and the Holy Spirit."

**#1326** Finally, by the Eucharistic Celebration we already unite ourselves with the heavenly liturgy and anticipate eternal life, when God will be all in all.
